Investigation of Michigan's Mental Health System under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

The United States Department of Justice (DOJ) is conducting a civil rights investigation under the ADA.

We are investigating whether the State of Michigan is subjecting adults with mental health disabilities to unnecessary institutional stays at State psychiatric hospitals.

We want to understand if these adults could live in the community if they had access to services like supportive housing, assertive community treatment (ACT), crisis services, and peer support services.
